





Piñatas



HB 410 Makes Changes to School Attendance Policy

Elementary Attendance Policy Changes 2017-2018

- Students arriving between 7:55 AM and 8:25 AM are Tardy
- Students arriving after 8:25 AM have a Partial Absence
- Students leaving at any time between 7:55 AM and 3:05 PM have a Partial Absence for the time missed
- Absences are accumulated by time missed; 6 hours = 1 day

Reminder: Parents must call or email Mrs. Stumpp in the office (not the teacher) before 8:30 AM for any absence. If no contact is made with the elementary office prior to the absence, you must send an email or written note to Mrs. Stumpp with the following information within 48 hours of the student's return, or the absence will be UNEX-CUSED.

Middle School Attendance Policy Changes 2017-2018

- Middle school students arriving to school between 7:50 and 8:20 A.M. are considered "tardy". After those first 30 minutes of the school day, it is considered a partial day absence.
- When students have 5 school days (32.5 hours) of absence, a letter advising parents and students of an attendance concern is mailed.
- When students have 6 school days (38 hours) of absence within one school month, the county attendance officer mails the family a letter advising parents and students of an attendance concern.
- When students have 10 school days (65 hours) of absence during the school year, the county attendance officer mails the family a letter and medical excuses are required for any subsequent absences to be excused.
- All absences require parent contact to the MS office (419-299-3384) prior to 8:30 A.M. the day of the absence.
- Please refer to the student-parent handbook for more information on attendance.

High School Attendance Policy Changes 2017-2018

- High School students arriving to school between 7:50 8:20 AM will be considered "Tardy". After those first 30 minutes of the school day, it is considered a partial day absence.
- High school students leaving anytime between 7:50 AM and 2:50 PM will have a Partial Absence for the time missed.
- When high school students have 5 school days (32.5 hours) of absence, a letter advising parents and students of an attendance concern is mailed.
- When high school students have 6 school days (38 hours) of absence within one school month, the county attendance officer mails the family a letter advising parents and students of the attendance concern.
- When high school students have 10 school days (65 hours) of absence during the school year, the county attendance officer mails the family a letter and medical excuses are required for any subsequent absence to be labeled "excused". (This is a significant change to what was our attendance policy as listed in our student Agenda book. High school students will no longer have up to seven days of absence in the second semester, but will only have up to 10 days (65 hours) of absence in a school year.)
- All absences require parent contact to the high school office by 8:30 AM the day of the absence. (419) 299-3384.

"What is 4-H?"

4-H is the ultimate youth development experience that uses adult volunteers, peer learning through demonstration and family participation. 4-H members learn in a variety of ways but most projects offer a "learn by doing approach" and with over 200 different projects available to take, there is something to interest everyone. The clubs are led by trained adults that work within the scope of the Ohio State University Extension program to help guide members and families through the 4-H experience. 2017 Knight Staff Earns Silver Rating From CSPA

The 2017 <u>Knight</u> staff recently learned it earned a silver rating from the Columbia Scholastic Press Association for its work on last year's yearbook. This rating reflected a score increase from 729 in 2016 to 762 in 2017.

The goal of entering the CSPA contest each year is to gain feedback about the previous year's publication which can be applied during the current year. The ultimate goal is to earn a gold rating, which is a score from 800-1,000. The staff's scores have progressed each year from a 583 in 2014, the first year they participated in the CSPA judging, to last year's 762.

According to Columbia University, the judging process begins "when publications are mailed to the Association's offices in New York City. From there they are mailed, in batches, to qualified faculty advisers of student publications, who constitute the CSPA's Board of Judges. These advisers are located throughout the United States and Canada."
